A. Welcome and Introductions

B. Recap of Task Force Objectives and Timeline

Mr. Viviano reviewed the charge of the task force, emphasizing that the policies to be discussed and considered by the task force should be within SEMCOG's issue areas of transportation, environment, community and economic development, and education. C. Final Review of the SEMCOG 2025-2026 Legislative Policy Platform

Mr. Viviano led final review and discussion of SEMCOG's 2025-2026 Legislative Policy Platform. Discussion included two revisions:

- Remove parenthetical from the following policy, to avoid misinterpretation:
 Minimize activities and support legislation to address the negative impacts on air and water
 quality for protection of public health and natural assets (e.g., known traditional sources of
 pollution and unknown sources like from climate engineering programs).
- Replace "Advocacy" narrative with the following, to reflect SEMCOG's partnerships and coalition work:
 - Advancing SEMCOG's bipartisan legislative priorities depends on the active support of SEMCOG members, partners, and coalitions across the region, state, and nation. Strengthening and expanding our relationships with federal and State legislators and regulators is vital to championing the interests of our communities, Southeast Michigan, and the State of Michigan. SEMCOG offers this Legislative Policy Platform to empower community leaders, along with our staff experts, to effectively engage with representatives in Lansing and Washington.

After discussion, **MOTION** by Chris Barnett, Supervisor, Orion Township, to recommend Executive Committee Approval of the 2025-2026 SEMCOG Legislative Policy Platform. The **MOTION** carried.
