

CRP | CARBON REDUCTION PROGRAM

The following infographic presents how the SEMCOG region benefits from Carbon Reduction Program (CRP). CRP funding is led by Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) to help meet the requirements of the Clean Air Act through the reduction of carbon dioxide. The awarding of funds between 2023 – 2029 has supported road, non-motorized and transit needs, totaling \$78 million in federal funds towards 67 projects.

Each of these projects was awarded by a committee made up of public officials and citizens throughout the region. Some of the more popular project types include energy efficient streetlights, traffic signal projects, roundabouts, and transit upgrades.
